Purpose

Foundations are forever scouts, trying to recognize the big questions of the time and to find the right opportunities for intervention through effective funding.

The Schöpflin Stiftung, for one, is in the process of giving its *Fair & Sustainable Economy* Programme a new orientation. Coming from support for opposition to the trade and investment deals TTIP & CETA, the need to curb corporate power is in its view as well as the need to strengthen & develop democracy. It is on a learning journey and would like to share some of it with trusted fellow foundations.

We invite to an exchange on foundations' thinking about the pertinent topics of the future and about the priority setting in their philanthropy. We offer an exchange with some interesting thinkers that we and some other foundations have identified.

Style of Event

We will play with the **metaphor of pollination** to guide us through. A range of topics present themselves as flowers, not all of equal beauty, but all waiting to be fertilized and bring forth some seeds. Pollinators come in many forms – insects and mammals, solitary and social. We'll limit ourselves to the honey bees and the bumble bees. The honey bees are special in that they produce honey, beeswax, and royal jelly – they write books, articles, give speeches, perhaps establish whole communities of thought & practice. The bumble bees build smaller nests and less elaborate combs, but also distribute pollen and collect nectar - they wise up and design funding programmes. Each have their place in the ecosystem.
